RE: NOTIFICATION OF FINAL FINDINGS OF THE PEOPLE'S TRIBUNAL ON ECONOMIC CRIME

1. The Organising Committee of the People's Tribunal on Economic Crime ('People's Tribunal')¹ hereby notifies your offices of the final findings of the first People's Tribunal delivered in Johannesburg on 20 September 2018.
2. The findings follow a five day public hearing in February 2018 which focussed on economic crime in the arms trade in South Africa over the past forty years. At the hearings the public and implicated parties had the opportunity to present and respond to evidence on economic crimes and corruption and apartheid during Apartheid, the 1999 Arms Deal and in contemporary allegations of state capture. Please see the attached document for further detail on the process and notice to state institutions following the findings (attached and marked '**Annexure A**').
3. We request that as a representative of the electorate in parliament, you consider the findings of the of the People's Tribunal and introduce them, along with the requests in Annexure A during appropriate parliamentary processes and sittings of the Portfolio on Justice and Correctional Development, amongst others.
4. We trust that you will engage with these important findings of the People's Tribunal in order to ensure accountability of public and private sector actors implicated in the findings.
